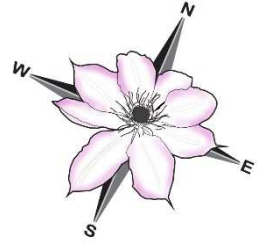

Please order seeds by 31st January 2023

Many thanks to our new Seed Exchange Administrators, Mike Miller (USA), Ingrid Kastell (EU-Sweden) and Guy Opie (UK). The Society would like to present a single Seed Exchange List to its Members so that all Members are able to order seed and grow their own clematis, especially some unusual species.

The Seed Exchange Administrators have been working out how they can send seed between these 3 Areas of the world and believe that they will be able to do this by applying for the relevant documentation.

You can also order seed from within your own Area where you live (USA, EU, UK). There are seeds available in all 3 Areas.

How to Order Seed:

Please send all requests for seeds to Mike Miller by **31st January 2023**.

Mike's email is: mjmil@comcast.net Please put **SEED EXCHANGE** in the title of the email so that your request does not get lost in his email!

Please email Mike your name and address and list the seeds by number you would like from the list below.

The Society decided several years ago there will be no charge for seeds. If, though, you would like to donate towards the running of the Seed Exchange, please add a little extra to your Membership Fee.

How the Process will Work:

At the end of January Mike will assemble all the seed requests and work out which seeds will be sent between the different Areas. The seeds will be sent in one batch between the different Areas to minimise the paperwork and inspection costs. So please get your seed request to Mike by the date above!

The process of transferring seeds between the Areas may take several months so please be patient!

If you request seeds which are held in your Area, then should receive the seeds sooner than if you request seeds from a different Area. If you are keen to get started, you should bear this in mind!

Seed List Table Key

No = unique identifier for ordering seed

Area of origin = seed collected and held in either EU, UK or USA

Name = parent plant as submitted by Donor

Pollination information = OP is short for Open Pollinated

Donor = name of person or organisation who donated the seed. FRCC = The Friends of the Rogerson Clematis Collection

Donor comments = any additional comments from the Donor
